



Servant Leadership Development Group Scholarship

Description: The Servant Leadership Development Group (SLDG) Scholarship has been designed for students who plan to serve full-time in a cross-cultural church ministry in a Hispanic or Latino country, OR those who plan to enter full-time vocational ministry in a domestic church ministry context that is intentionally cross-cultural to the Hispanic/Latino community.

Who Can Apply: Students in the Doctor of Ministry, Master of Divinity, Master of Arts in Ministry, Master of Arts in Biblical and Theological Studies, Master of Arts in Counseling, Master of Theology, and Graduate Diploma programs are eligible to apply for this award, including incoming students who have been admitted to Phoenix Seminary without a bachelor's degree.

Award: This award is equal to 75% of tuition and fees.

Requirements:

- Recipients must complete a minimum of two credit hours per semester.
- Recipients must also maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5.
- Recipients must submit a “thank you” note upon receipt of this scholarship.

Additional Terms and Details:

- This award will be issued for one academic year beginning in the fall semester and continuing through the spring and summer semesters. If issued in the spring or summer semesters, the award will only be valid for the remaining terms in the same academic year. Recipients are not required to reapply each year, and can continue to receive the scholarship in following academic years provided they continue to meet the GPA + credit requirements and the SLDG committee grants approval for the student to continue receiving the scholarship.
- This award is equal to 75% of tuition and fees for each awarded semester. The award applies only to the tuition cost of courses taken for credit, any required non-credit courses, and fees. This scholarship does not apply to any elective non-credit courses or textbooks.
- Due to the value of this award (75% of tuition) it may not be combined with any other discounts or scholarships issued by Phoenix Seminary. Acceptance of this scholarship will automatically decline all other awards for its duration. The Church Partnership Grant (CPG) is the only exception to this policy as the CPG may be combined with the SLDG Scholarship.
- This award is subject to enrollment in a minimum of two credit hours per semester. Students enrolled in less than the minimum required credit hours will forfeit the award for the current and subsequent semesters. Students who do not successfully complete the required credit hours with a passing grade will forfeit the award for subsequent semesters.

- Recipients must maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 to remain eligible for the award in the subsequent semesters. Students may reapply once the minimum GPA has been reestablished.
- Recipients are required to submit a “thank you” note addressed to the donor(s) prior to the start of the first semester of their award. Thank you notes should be sealed and submitted to the student’s Student Service Advisor (SSA). Failure to submit this note on time may result in the loss of the award for subsequent semesters.
- Students on Academic Probation or Disciplinary Probation will become ineligible for the award in the subsequent semesters. Students may reapply once the probation has been lifted.
- Students may appeal the loss of their scholarship via an official petition. Student may request an appeal form by contacting their Student Service Advisor (SSA). Students will be notified of the decision within two weeks of submitting the appeal. All appeal decisions are final.
- Any scholarship award(s) from Phoenix Seminary will be applied to a student’s account after all external scholarships, benefits, and grants have been applied. Should the seminary’s award(s) create an overage on the student’s account, the award(s) from Phoenix Seminary will be reduced. Phoenix Seminary’s policy is to award scholarships to cover tuition only.
- This scholarship is awarded without regard to race, gender, ethnicity, or national origin.
- All scholarship awards are subject to available funding.
